Evans Mountain Flamingo Migration Flock-a-Friend



Migrating flamingos are flocking! "Flocking," as it has become known, is the fund-raising effort that accounts for flamingos showing up on lawns all over the country - most recently in Strafford, New Hampshire. All proceeds will benefit the Campaign to Save Evans Mountain and Bear-Paw Regional Greenways' land protection program.

Here's how it works: Someone contributes \$25 to the Campaign to Save Evans Mountain to place a flock of pink plastic flamingos on one of their friend's or neighbor's lawn (or somewhere else) for a day. The recipient gets a pink sign explaining the rules and an opportunity to return the favor. For another \$25 donation that recipient may choose to send the flamingos on to their next destination. Campaign to Save Evans Mountain

Bear-Paw Regional Greenways, the Blue Hills Foundation, and the Town of Strafford are combining efforts to conserve 1,015 acres of valuable wildlife habitat on Evans Mountain overlooking Bow Lake. The property is part of a 6,000-acre unfragmented forest connected to conservation focus areas identified in the NH Wildlife Action Plan (WAP) and the Conservation Plan for New Hampshire's Coastal Watersheds. Permanent conservation of the Evans Mountain property has been a goal of the Town of Strafford for over three decades and is recognized as a priority in the town's Master Plan and Bear-Paw's Conservation Plan.



The property was acquired by Bear-Paw, the Blue Hills Foundation, and the Town of Strafford in January 2010 but we still have to raise over \$500,000 to pay off the loans and permanently protect it.

The current plan is for ownership of the property to be conveyed to the Blue Hills Foundation, a 501(c)3 private foundation, and the Town subject to a conservation easement held by Bear-Paw. Once conserved, a comprehensive plan will be prepared to guide management and restoration activities on the property. Public access will be assured by the conservation easement protecting the property.
